Part I: Lectures*

Part II: Hands-on workshops*

2. SWOT analysis of the local needs and efforts to plan local cultural policy.
3. Building a masterplan for local enhancement based on the collaboration of social and cultural stakeholders.
4. Digital enhancement with social involvement: the example of the electronic platform *#outofrome* and participatory processes.



Location Delphi

Delphi is a renowned Greek destination known worldwide as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** for the temple and oracle of Apollo. In the area of Central Greece only **2,5 hours away from Athens**, Delphi is located on Mount Parnassus among olive trees and in the middle of the unique **Delphic Landscape**.

The Greeks considered Delphi the navel (or centre) of the world, as represented by the stone monument known as the **Omphalos**.



The **Cultural Education Centre** is situated in the heart of Delphi on the ground floor of our host guesthouse.

This space is a multi-purpose room that can be used as a meeting room or laboratory, for a small conference (up to 100 people), for events and exhibitions, and disposes of two bathrooms, a small kitchen and two storage rooms

The guesthouse has a capacity of 12 rooms and can host up to 40 guests and includes a common space/ living room on the first floor, a courtyard and the laboratory/ working space.
