Dr. Vasileios Laopodis, President and Founder of CulturePolis



Vasileios Laopodis studied Physics in Athens, B.A & Informatics in Toulouse, France where he got his Doctorate degree in Informatics. He worked in various technical and management positions mainly as ICT expert in the private sector (IBM, FIAT, Banking), and also lectured in Greek and foreign universities. In 1988 he joined the European Commission in Luxembourg and later in Brussels (1988-2006) and held several positions dealing with EU policies and programmes related to Research & Technological Innovation and New Technologies/ ICTs.

He was particularly involved in initiatives focusing on the dissemination and exploitation of EU RTD & I results and their impact on society and economy.

He has published several books/articles mainly on ICT management and policies and social and cultural impact of new technologies. He is a Greek native speaker and speaks professionally English and French.

He has been founder, member of Board and president of professional associations (Greek Computer Society), NGOs and Director of consultancy, publishing and certification firms; and in 2006 he retired from the European Commission and founded in Corfu the non-profit organization CulturePolis and since then, he has been its President.



Afrodi Kamara, Historian-Cultural Heritage Consultant, Director of Time Heritage

Afrodi Kamara studied History at the National and Capodistrian University of Athens and specialized in the social and religious history of the Middle East through her graduate and post-graduate studies in Manchester and Oxford respectively. She worked for six years (1999-2005) as Research Historian at the Foundation of the Hellenic World. In 2003 she co-founded Time Heritage of which she became sole representative and manager in 2005. Beyond planning and implementation of the company's projects, she has been teaching and

researching individually on history, heritage management and enhancement of heritage in digital environments.

Since 2005 she is also member of the Hellenic ICOMOS.
